

## A Garden Shed, A Cozy Workspace

Turns out the ideal "home office" may be in your backyard. Remove the lawnmower, weed wacker and tool collection from your garden shed and escape to a new world just a few steps outside your back door. The British have honored the shed for thousands of years. While the resurgence of cottage gardens continues to sweep the nation, now they embrace a new trend -- shed-scapism.

Artists and writers seek refuge here, a separate building that still feels like home. Tools are replaced with laptops, and creative flow permeates this cozy habitat. In Oxford, Ted Dewan writes and illustrates Bing children's cartoons in his shed, tucked away in a garden. He tells BBC, "In a nation where the headquarters of its highest office are in a nondescript terraced house called Number 10, it seems Brits may work best in an approachable, non-intimidating environment."

World-famous authors Roald Dahl and Dylan Thomas discovered this escape in the 1950s. They wrote renowned pieces in their sheds with Dahl known for his children's stories and Thomas for his poetry.

Surrounded by his young children, Dahl could not find a peaceful place to write in his own home. He visited Thomas's "word-splashed hut" on the edge of a cliff in Carmarthenshire where Dahl found the answer to

# Iconic Building Of The Month

## This month's Iconic Building is The Chicago City Hall Green Roof:

Chicago City Hall Green Roof is a beautiful science project. Its garden rustles in the breeze atop an 11-story office building. Completed in 2001, a team of architects, structural engineers, ecologists and contractors came together to create it. Architectural firm William McDonough & Partners contributed and Conservation Design Forum designed the garden. The 1,885-square-meter roof garden is covered with 20,000 herbaceous plants of 150 varieties. In response to the urban heat island effect, this project is part of an EPA study to improve air quality.

During Chicago's 1995 heat wave, a number of lives were lost. The City realized one solution was to establish green roofs around their concrete jungle. Studies completed in the first summer showed that the roof surface temperature reduced by 70 degrees Fahrenheit and the air reduced by 15 Fahrenheit. The space retains 75% of a one-inch rainfall before stormwater runs off into the sewers.

Passersby can look up at this lush landscape, a green space that is not meant for public access but does wonders for the community's quality of life. It won the ASLA Merit Award for Design 2002, IL-ASLA Honor Award for Design 2002 and WWF National Earth Hour City Challenge 2014. Its success inspired Chicago's Green Roof Initiative, which established 200 roof gardens (and growing).



Of course, each artist is inspired in different ways. Dahl huddled in dim light, whereas Thomas looked out off a cliff through large windows. In Dahl’s nest, he surrounded himself with inspirational quotes and photos. His desk was covered with boiled sweets and mementos such as the hip bone he kept after a hip replacement. Thomas preferred a simpler “dÉcor”.

Nowadays, fellow creatives are catching on in the U.K. There is even a vote for the Shed of the Year on


